# The Trowel and Spiritual Evolution

## "Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity." Psalms 133:1

The trowel is the symbol of that which has the power to bind men together. What is this unifying power? We frequently meet with men who seem to lack unity in their makeup; a spirit of disorganization or anarchy is at work in them so that they seem to live at cross-purposes with themselves. What they know they should do they do not, and many things which they do they do against their own will. They may have personal force, but it is scattered and their lives never come into focus.

Of these men we say that they lack character. Character comes from the word that originally meant a graving tool; after long use the name of the tool came to be applied to the engraving itself, and thus the term has come to stand for a man whose actions give one an impression of definiteness and clear-cuttedness, like an engraving. The trowel is intended to remind us of that true character, the essential ingredient necessary for one man to properly bong with another.

Francis Bacon so thoroughly exemplified the spirit of fraternalism, that is of men bonding together to perform works of great charity, that his memory is largely associated with the Fellowcraft Degree. Bacon was at various times in his life Lord Chancellor of England, a philosopher, an author, a statesman, scientist, orator and humorist. He was one of the prophets of the scientific revolution and instigated the formation of the Royal Society. Bro. Bacon edited the first King James version of the Holy Bible and is thought by many to actually have authored several works attributed to Shakespeare.

Bacon secretly founded the first Lodge of Free & Accepted Masons in England. He wrote the second degree ritual, which by his creation emphasized the liberal arts and sciences. In addition, he founded the first Rosicrucian Brotherhood and secretly laid the groundwork for the eventual establishment of the United States of American. Using Masonic symbolism, Bacon wrote the *New Atlantis*, which many contend contains the keys to all Masonic ritual.

Bacon's example, so essential to the true symbolism of the Trowel, was that of a Master Mason building for the future. In building for the future, one must instill in others the vital essence of one's own purpose. Bacon's dreams were realizable because the early Freemasons embraced his vision and purpose. His dreams were the cement that bound the brotherhood to the process of regeneration, that is, to everlasting renewal.

That philosophy is embodied in the three degrees of Freemasonry. From grade to grade, the candidate is led from an old to an entirely new quality of life. The candidate begins his Masonic life as the natural man and ends it by becoming a regenerated "perfected" man. He symbolically rises from the dead a Master, a just man made perfect, with larger consciousness and faculties, an efficient instrument for use by the Great Architect in His plan of rebuilding the Temple of fallen humanity, and capable of advancing other men to a participation in the same great work.

Thus, the Trowel also teaches us that the real purpose of modern Freemasonry is, not the social and charitable purposes to which so much appropriate attention is paid, but the expediting of the spiritual evolution of those who aspire to perfect their own nature and transform it into a more god-like quality. The challenge of Freemasonry is to be reborn "incorruptible" which must be preceded by the death of the lower nature. Consequently, the intention of Masonry is not the building of a temple, but the greater science of soul building using the cement of brotherly love and affection.

## The Operative and Speculative


Just as operative masons use special tools for particular situations, so speculative Masons must learn to use specialized trowels for spreading the cement of brotherly love and affection. Operative craftsmen use corner trowels, curbing trowels, guttering trowels, brick trowels, pointing trowels- each one shaped and fashioned for a particular operation.

Speculative Master Masons must learn to use the specialized trowels of appreciation, admiration, compliment, and congratulations to spread the mortar of mutual esteem that harmonious community life requires. Speculative Master Masons must learn to use the specialized trowels of forbearance and conciliation to spread the cement of mutual respect and confidence without which democracy cannot function. Speculative Master Masons must learn to use the specialized trowel of reverence for truth and for the dignity of every individual, no matter how disagreeable either may be, to infuse into public life the essential ingredients of personal freedom.

Speculative Master Masons must learn to use the specialized trowels of kindness and gentleness, of compassion and service to all men, if they would spread the cement of genuine love and understanding. This must be the great objective of Masonic education, if builders are to learn how to use their tools properly, especially the trowel. This must be the fundamental program of Freemasonry, if it is to remain true to the central purpose of its ancient charges and landmarks. Just as an operative workman learns to use each trowel for particular need or situation, so every Master Mason needs to learn the uses of the spiritual trowels that symbolize the power of brotherly love and friendship.

# Symbology: THE TROWEL



Masonic symbolisms are of two kinds, direct and allusive. The trowel belongs to the first class, because naturally an indispensable instrument of the building art for which an explanation would have to be contrived in any case, in a system based upon architecture. The shape of the trowel, however, is distinctive, its blade being of a specialized form, different from any other known tool.

With this shape in mind, examine the outline of the space between square and compasses, usually filled in with the letter G, and it will become apparent that the point of the trowel is an angle of 60 degrees, while its base is one of 90 degrees, in which the handle is set. The moment that this proportion is recognized the outline of the trowel becomes the geometrical basis of the emblematic square and compasses themselves, and the line between the extreme points has the value of the letter Jod, the initial of the name of God in Hebrew. As Jod represents Spirit acting upon Matter, causing it inchoate particles to cohere in shapely proportions, so the trowel is the instrument employed by the master masons to unite fragmentary building material upon symmetrical and orderly plans.

The rescripts ordering the compasses to be open at an angle of 60 degrees, and defining the square as an angle of 90 degrees, are, like countless other Masonic allusions, references to geometrical formulas, well known to our ancient brethren, which have become lost to the craft of today.


