# The Masonic Home of Virginia: Founders Day Origins



October is Founders Month in Virginia Masonry, and on October 9<sup>th</sup> the Grand Lodge of Virginia will celebrate Founders Day.

In 1871, Masons in the Richmond area of Virginia began discussing the need for a Masonic Orphanage. Several different committees were appointed by the Grand Lodge between the years 1871 and 1888. These committees were instructed to survey the need for a Masonic Orphan Asylum in Virginia. When the committees reported back to the Grand Lodge, they consistently stated the establishment of such an institution was not feasible. As far as can be found, no reasons were given for the negative reports; however, it was clear that such a daunting task needed a spark to light the fire.

Dr. George Potts, born in Canterbury, England and a member of Astrea Lodge No. 85, made several eloquent appeals to the committees and to Grand Lodge, encouraging the establishment of a home for orphans, but without success. In December 1889, Dr. Potts made a particularly eloquent plea to Masons assembled in Grand Lodge. Moved by the reasoning and passion of Dr. Potts' speech, Captain A. G. Babcock offered a gift of \$5,000 in cash and a conditional pledge of further assistance if the home were established. This pledge motivated the Grand Lodge Committee to amend its previous action and favorably report on the need and feasibility of a home for orphans.

In response to the Committee report and the pending gift, a groundswell of support emerged among the delegates to Grand Lodge and a resolution was adopted, authorizing the establishment of a Home for orphans of Virginia Master Masons. The committee assigned to the task petitioned a charter from the General Assembly, which was adopted on January 7, 1890 (The actual date of the founding of the Masonic Home of Virginia).

Subsequent to the chartering, on February 18th, 1890, Captain Babcock donated real estate consisting of "44½ acres of excellent farming land on Nine Mile Road, with a dwelling of ten rooms in good order, a large barn and stable recent built, and all of the other necessary outhouses." This property made up the bulk of what is today the grounds of the Masonic Home. Additional parcels from Captain Babcock and others were added over the years to achieve the total of today's ninety acres.

## FOUNDER'S DAY - CONTINUED

From this humble beginning, our Masonic Home raised 839 children of Virginia Master Masons from 1890 to 1975. (Some of which are members of WSL60) However, as time moved forward, the need for a Home for children decreased. This drop in demand was likely spurred on by a number of factors like safer workplaces, better work opportunities to Masonic Widows, and an increased role of the state in caring for orphans and the destitute. With fewer children coming through its gates, the Masonic Home decided to pivot. In the 1950s it decided to open to retirees creating a Home for the Aged.

In 1953 the Grand Lodge of Virginia, by order of Most Worshipful Charles M. Lanford, Jr., (See portrait below) transferred \$125,000 (more than \$1.1 million today) to the Masonic Home of Virginia to build its Home for the Aged. Construction began in the middle of 1953, but was halted in early 1954 as it became too costly to complete. This could have put an end to the hopes of a retirement community for the Freemasons of Virginia, but thanks to the leadership of Most Worshipful Hugh M. Reid, (See portrait below) who suggested it begin long-range planning, it continued. The Grand Lodge transferred another \$100,000 to the Home, and in 1955, the Masonic Home as it currently operates began.

Much has changed since the beginning of the Adult Home. Our leadership has added separate cottages, expansive apartments, state of the art nursing care, secure memory support areas, and a huge dining room. There is a library, beauty shop, and fitness center. The Masonic Home has cared for over 1200 adults since it's began. And it owes its existence to the perseverance and generosity of masons with the foresight and courage that began the journey leading to today's Masonic Home of Virginia.
