With the next \$250.00 donated, no matter how long it takes, a Master Craftsman plaque will be presented to him. Continued donations are rewarded with different awards, for higher levels of giving. All are cumulative, in 5 year increments. The key is the first lump sum \$250.00 donation. The Masonic Home appreciates the contributions of the Brethren and wants to recognize them for their generosity.

As we move into the second quarter of the year, I wanted to provide an update on the activities of your Masonic Corporation. We have negotiated two contracts as we continue to update and improve our 50+ year old building. Lynch Roofing will be replacing the roof with a new roof system that will have a slope instead of being flat which should allow for better drainage.
